



Construction of upgrades and improvements to the City of Hackensack’s storm sewers under the Stormwater Infrastructure Improvements 2020 Project; Contract 1: Polifly Park Drainage Improvements and Contract 2: Pine Street Roadway Improvements (both under NJWB No. S340923-15), located in Hackensack, New Jersey, in the amount of approximately \$1.44M were financed by the New Jersey Water Bank (NJWB). The NJWB is a State Revolving Fund program jointly administered by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (Infrastructure Bank) and uses a combination of funds provided by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, the DEP, and the Infrastructure Bank to provide very low interest loans to borrowers for environmental infrastructure projects.

These projects will provide water quality benefits by addressing existing deficiencies within the storm sewer systems, which result in localized flooding and other stormwater drainage issues and inefficiencies. These improvements will improve water quality for residents and businesses surrounding Polifly Park, as well as along South Newman Street, Temple Avenue, Pine Street, South River Street (east of Lafayette Street) and Hudson Street (between Water and Kennedy Streets) in the City of Hackensack.

State Revolving Fund programs around the nation provide states and communities the resources necessary to maintain and improve the infrastructure protecting our valuable water resources nationwide.
